

## **FAQ's about the campsite**

### **Where can I get my wrist band?**

All persons camping may obtain their wrist band at the TSB Stadium from 9am on Friday. All persons to be wrist banded must attend including children and they must bring their 3-day pass tickets and their campsite tickets in order to be given the correct wrist band. On Saturday and Sunday wrist banding will take place at the entrance gates to the festival.

### **Where can I get a program?**

All three day ticket holders will be issued with a free program at the same time as they get wrist banded. One day ticket holders may purchase a program for \$6 from the Womad Store.

### **Where are the toilets and showers?**

There are toilets and showers in the TSB Stadium and the jockeys changing area of the La Mer Stand. Additionally there are temporary toilets and showers situated in the family camping area and in the general camping area. They are all marked on the campsite map.

### **Where can I wash my dishes?**

There are dedicated wash-up containers located by the temporary toilets/showers in the family camping area and by the temporary toilets/showers in the general camping area. Boiling water, for baby's bottles etc., can be obtained at the TSB Stadium kitchen.

### **Where can I get water?**

There are water taps situated throughout the general camping and the family areas and at the temporary toilets/showers. There is also a tap outside the TSB Stadium.

### **Where are the disabled camping areas?**

The designated area for less able campers is to the side of the TSB Stadium and is exclusively for use by such persons, any other persons camping there will be asked to move.

### **Where are the disabled facilities?**

There are disabled toilets and showers situated in the TSB Stadium, and the disabled camping area is adjacent to the side of the TSB Stadium.

### **Is there transport to the main site for the disabled?**

Yes there will be transport in the form of golf carts for those less able to undertake the walk to the main WOMAD site. These can be picked up from outside the TSB Stadium. There is no timetable but they will be making frequent visits during the festival.

### **Where can I charge my cell phone?**

There are power sockets situated in the TSB Stadium foyer. However if phones are left there charging they remain the owners responsibility.

**Where are the supermarkets?**

All supermarkets, shops, café's, restaurants and service stations can be found in the city which can be reached at the bottom of Gover Street.

**Where is the Ezicamp?**

The ready erected tents are to be found directly in front of the Tuson Stand. These tents come complete with mattresses and there will be a small shop to purchase other camping requirements.

**Where can I make a telephone call?**

There is a pay phone situated in the TSB Stadium foyer.

**Can I get a breakfast on site?**

Breakfast can be purchased in the La Mer Stand between 7am and 11am on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

**Can I park next to my tent?**

You may park next to your tent but it is not guaranteed that you will be able to drive out at all times. If you wish to use your car during your stay we recommend you park in one of the designated car parks adjacent to the TSB Stadium.

**How do I get to the main WOMAD site?**

There is a signposted track from the TSB Stadium along the tar sealed road that passes behind the racecourse stands, past the new rock retaining wall, past the entrance to the general camping area, through the metal gate and turn right in front of the new stables to a sealed roadway that leads downhill to the racecourse entrance to the main WOMAD site adjacent to the Bowl Stage. Care should be taken on this roadway as from time to time artists coaches use the same roadway.

**Is there going to be horse training during the festival?**

Yes there will be horse training sessions held between approximately 6am and 9am on Saturday and Monday mornings. These periods will be marshaled to ensure the safety of the campers, jockeys and horses. There will therefore be limited access across the tracks during this time. Extreme care should be taken if attempting to cross the tracks and the direction of the marshals MUST be complied with. All items that can flap in the wind, such as towels, blankets etc., which are attached to the fence at the sides of the racecourse, MUST be removed as they can cause distress to the horses.

**Where can I report lost property?**

All reports of lost property on the campsite can be made at the Camp Office situated in the TSB Stadium. Lost property on the main WOMAD site can be reported to the WOMAD Daily News Information Centre.

**Where can I put my rubbish?**

There are rubbish bins situated throughout the site, please use these bins as indicated and support the recycling initiative.

**How do I get to the general camping area?**

Drive past the TSB Stadium and behind the racecourse stands, continue along the sealed road past the rock retaining wall and turn left through the open metal gate and cross the grass and sand tracks. Please camp in a sensible and tidy manner on the grass area in the centre of the tracks or as directed.
